The author has in his study analysed the ASP Gender Program in the Eastern Province Kawoozi in Zambia. The results indicate that the relations between women and men have changes over time since the gender program was introduced. In the social area women and men are today sharing the homework that previously strictly was divided by sex. Also the economy has evolved through the change in interaction between the sexes, from being totally dominated by men towards a mutual responsibility between the women and men concerning planning of the management and budget of the fields and in the economy.
